

## **A Million Candles**

My Grandfather Will was a soldier in World War 1. He never spoke of his ordeal, and as I have read about and watched films about the conditions in which men fought for their country I can understand why. The horror was too much to speak about.

August 4<sup>th</sup> marks 100 years since the beginning of that war. To commemorate this The Royal British Legion is asking people to turn off their lights and to use a single candle or light for an hour from 10pm on August 4th. This has been inspired by the words of the then Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey, who said on the eve of war: "The lamps are going out all over Europe; we shall not see them lit again in our life-time." It is hoped that far from being cast in darkness, a million candles will be lit across the UK to commemorate every serviceman and woman who died.

A candle-lit vigil will take place at Westminster Abbey which will be broadcast live on BBC2. Our own Cathedral in Wells will be open and a service of prayer will begin at 10pm. The congregation will process by candlelight to the Recreation Ground where a new poppy bed will be dedicated. This special event will be an opportunity to reflect on a war that killed 16 million young people in Europe.

For many, attending a service at 10pm is not possible but there will be a short service in Pilton Parish Church at 6.00pm on Monday August 4<sup>th</sup>. People from all our village communities will be very welcome at this service. This will be a quiet act of commemoration in which we will remember the impact of the Great War on so many lives, families and communities. The lives of those lost and the scars of war on participants had far-reaching effects and the need for healing continues for young lives shattered by conflict.

In all four of our churches candles will be available after the services on August 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>. These can be taken home and lit when you have your own time to reflect, and remember - perhaps at 10.00pm, perhaps at another time.
