



PILTON VILLAGE TRUST

When you receive this there will be a new set of Trustees elected at the AGM on 23rd November. 22 nominations were received and 3 resolutions. The Constitution states that all Trustees have to resign but can be re-elected. They will be responsible for taking the Trust forward in the future.

The survey of village opinions is now completed and will have been analysed and presented at the Trust's AGM. A report will be produced and made available. There were over a hundred replies with some distinct trends in the opinions: in all age groups in relation to the Club (PWMC, Worthy room), there was a desire to create a better atmosphere, improve the décor and generally make the Club more welcoming and comfortable. A Working Group of the Trustees, led by Lucy Smith and non- Trustee members, has been looking at refurbishment ideas for the Club. It will take views from the survey onboard and is at the stage of putting forward some refurbishment proposals for discussion and resolution. The newly elected Trustees will consider these
