Seeking justice is 'absolutely central' to Christian faith Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury

When Christians speak in public about community flourishing or about justice, there's always someone who will pop up and ask why we're sticking our noses in, as if these things were miles away from the proper concerns of Christianity. Recently there have been the issues of money and credit unions and power costs of which the church has spoken. Stick to God, we are told. So we do, and we find Jesus saying: Love God, love our neighbour.

The common good of the community and justice are absolutely central to what it means to be a Christian. They flow from the love of Jesus on the Cross, offering salvation, enabling justice and human freedom.

Loving God and loving our neighbour go together like the warp and the weft of a piece of fabric. They hold each other in place and together can be strong, and beautiful, and adaptable, for any number of uses. But each without the other would be disconnected strands. When we weave them together in our life as people of God, we open up a range of possibilities that can make a real difference. Possibilities that can transform lives and transform communities.

That is our calling. We don't speak about common good and justice because we think we have some automatic right to be heard, but because loving our neighbour places responsibilities upon us. We have responsibilities to act, to do what we can to make a difference, to work for our neighbour's flourishing, to bring justice. We have responsibilities to speak, even when it might be easier to stay quiet, to point to injustice and to challenge others to join us in righting it.

It shouldn't come as a surprise to anyone that the Church is part of the solution for building community blessing at local level – although I suspect that it might be questioned by some. We need the imagination to see where we can do more. And we need to be rooted in that vision God has set out for us, of welfare and of justice. It is the common good and justice that transforms our communities.

Family and friends gathered in Pilton Church on January 17th for a service to celebrate the life of **Winnie Cleaves**.


We are sad to report the deaths of **Kathleen Milne** and **Sir Frank Holroyd**, both of Pilton.



Fundraising for Syrian relief has been our aim during this month and North Wootton cafe was generous in giving the proceeds from their Christmas gift stall. This along with donations amounted to £121.20 for which the charity is most grateful.

We then embarked on an ambitious project: a new volunteer, Jan Dobbins, with vast musical expertise and contacts, decided to ask musician friends to perform in an Evening of Music for Syria. She recruited the Cathedral Voluntary Choir, the Mendip Ensemble and the Drystones, all of whose widely differing styles delighted the packed Town Hall in Wells. The only sad aspect was the number of people who were unable to buy tickets to hear the performers as it's unlikely that these performers will play together in another event.

Generous sponsorship from Serious Stages and private donors defrayed expenses and the UK government policy of doubling all fundraising for Syria until mid-February means that we will have raised around £2850 from the concert, which will become £5700 a wonderful result and we thank all those who helped in any way.

Bits from the Belfry

On New Year's Eve a band of ringers gathered in Pilton Tower to ring out the old year and welcome in the new. It is a centuries' old tradition that we like to maintain. Before midnight the bells are half muffled which means that the sound of the bells alternates between loud and soft. It gives a really haunting sound, the same sound as we use on Remembrance Sunday.

For as long as I can remember Pilton ringers have been joined by non-ringing friends and family who come to support this ancient ringing tradition. This year Pilton tower was full, as usual. Just before midnight all the muffs are

turned and at 12 seconds to midnight the Tenor sounds 'open' 12 times (its normal 'voice') and on the thirteenth stroke all the other bells, which are also open, join in to welcome the New Year.

Ring out, wild bells, to the wild sky The flying cloud, the frosty light The year is dying in the night; Ring out, wild bells, and let him die.

Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring happy bells, across the snow; The year is gone, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true.
