It was also a chance to ask God to bless the congregation and village, which we continue to do today. This year Rogation Day was officially on 6th May. However we have moved it to June in the hope that we will have a warmer day; time will tell!

To try and beat the bounds in a United Benefice would be rather a large challenge (do let me know if you want to give it a go sometime). As an alternative we all meet for a picnic at a farm in the middle of the Benefice, some people walk from our churches and some drive. Further details are in the magazine. Maybe you would like to come along and bring a picnic; you would be very welcome.

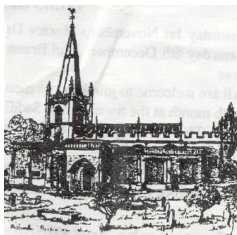
BENEFICE MID-WEEK HOLY COMMUNION

It was only through Val's generous legacy that we were able to consider applying for a grant to undertake such a major project as the roof repairs. With the vital and most welcome help of the Heritage Lottery Fund now the new lead is in place, the scaffolding is gone and the church is watertight again.

The beautiful lectern has been designed and made by Richard Donkersley, a West Country craftsman. It bears a small plaque in memory of Val. We hope as many people as possible, especially those who knew Val, will be able to join us at this special occasion - and stay for a celebratory glass of Pimms after the service.

BITS FROM THE BELFRY

Following the devastating fire at the Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris which started on the afternoon of Monday 15th April, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and Prime Minister Theresa May asked for bells at churches and cathedrals across the UK to ring out in solidarity when possible on Thursday 18th April (Maundy Thursday).

At Croscombe, the tenor (heaviest) bell was tolled for 7 minutes at 7.00pm on Maundy Thursday. Over 1,200 other churches and cathedrals across the United Kingdom and also in Ireland, Australia and New Zealand responded.

Saturday April 27th saw the annual striking competition of the local branch of the Bath & Wells Diocesan Association of Change Ringers, held at Westbury sub Mendip. The competition is to determine which team is able to ring its bells most accurately. Six teams entered, with Croscombe achieving a creditable third place behind Glastonbury and Wells. Well done, Croscombe!

May is the quarter peal month of the B&WDACR, to raise money for their Bell Fund which supports the repair, renovation and augmentation of rings of bells. Each ringer makes a small donation to the fund. The Croscombe band supported this, ringing a quarter peal of Plain Bob Doubles on Saturday 4th May. *Ken Brown*

GLASTONBURY FESTIVAL ARRANGEMENTS

Vehicle Passes – Village Vehicle Passes and your tickets will be available from Pilton Village Hall on Saturday 15th June 1pm - 6pm and on Friday 21st June 6pm – 8pm.

Village Car Park -Passes for the village car park are again limited this year and will only be issued to Pilton residents if their advance application is approved.

Cockmill Lane – A Temporary One-way Order will be in place in Cockmill Lane from Orchard Gate to Pylle Road (north bound). There will be no through traffic from the direction of Pylle Road (Pilton). The “Cockmill Lane Pass” will again be restricted to residents of Cockmill Lane and their visitors. Passes will also be issued to people with exceptional need to use Cockmill Lane.

Security – Security levels will be the same as last festival
Checkpoints – The checkpoints, as last year, will be operational from Saturday 22nd June- Monday 1st July. Full details of checkpoints, road closures and one-way systems available at Vehicle Passes Distribution.

Hot Line Number – 01749 899631 – is again operational all year. From 1st June this number will put you straight through to the festival office on site (26th June to 1st July).

Drop-in Centre –This year the Hot Line will be manned by staff in the Control Centre and will have access to all relevant people. There will be a member of GFL security at the Village Hall from 0800 – 2300 (26th June-1st July).

Village Lighting – The village will have the same level of lighting as in previous years.

CROSCOMBE CEVA PRIMARY SCHOOL

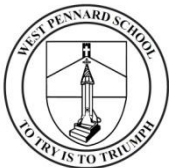
