So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night. And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

Although we cannot predict what the future will bring, many of us would like the assurance of safety expressed in the first line of the poem, but we all know that no one can give us that. The poem also reminds us that, however dark or light our lives feel, even in those darkest places we are never alone. For many of us we have friends and family we can count on but we also have the assurance that God is with us and all we have to do is reach out our hands.
