

Let's sing!

How many times have you heard a group of people say: 'We're just going out to have a good sing'? Probably not often! Singing, perhaps, isn't one of the most fashionable things to do. Yet singing is a central part of most occasions that are significant in our lives: birthdays and anniversaries have their own little ditties; Christmas isn't Christmas without chestnuts having a roast on an open fire; ceremonial occasions often involve singing the national anthem and most church services, whenever they take place, usually involve singing at least one hymn.

Singing is inclusive, everyone and anyone can be involved. If a person has a voice, then they can sing. Most people would say that they have a favourite song or hymn. Yes, some people may feel that others have a 'better' voice than them, but that doesn't mean that they are not able to sing. Some people are embarrassed by the thought of singing and prefer to sing only when they are on their own, perhaps in the shower. Even if they can't quite remember the words, they just make them up!

Singing has the capacity to create an emotional response in us and allows us to express and communicate with each other at a deeper level than mere words alone. It often has the power to remind us of occasions and people from the past; it creates atmosphere and can make us smile or cringe, sometimes even at the same time. Singing has the power to motivate people. You just have to look at the faces of rugby or football players singing their respective national anthems before a big international match to see the effect it has on the players and the crowd alike.

Singing helps us to remember. Charles Wesley knew this, which is why he wrote so many hymns for the early Methodists to sing. Methodism was birthed during the industrial revolution of the eighteenth century and many of the workers who joined those first Methodist Societies were barely literate, so for them to sing their faith was a means of them learning their faith. That's why so many of the hymns of that era were packed full of Christian doctrine.

The Reverend Brian Hoare, a past President of the Methodist Conference, has said that Methodism was 'Born in song.' And it's true in my experience that Methodists, of all people, certainly enjoy a good sing.

FESTIVAL INFORMATION

Access to Festival Site.

From Tuesday 3rd May the Festival site (Worthy Farm) becomes a designated construction site. With the work that will commence and the large amount of machinery moving and working it will be a hazardous area. Under rules enforced by the Health & Safety Executive, we are obliged to keep members of the public clear of the area. Please do not enter the Festival site or walk your dogs there. Notices will be displayed and the relevant orders to close footpaths have been obtained. At times, some areas might still be accessible. If you do come onto the site please keep away from areas of operation and respect any request to move away from areas where work is in place.

Clearway/Parking Enforcement in Pilton Village.

You may be aware that during the Festival the main route through Pilton to the Green/Village car park is a temporary Clearway, i.e no parking by any vehicle allowed. This route includes Parson's Batch, St Mary's Lane, Cumhill, Bread Street and Pylle Road. In the past this clearway has not been strictly enforced and the police allowed us to issue exemption passes to some residents. as agreed with the Parish Council, the Police and Somerset Council. The Parish Council have told us that they would like this Clearway to be strictly enforced this year. Somerset Highways have agreed to have enforcement officers regularly patrolling the area and issuing fixed penalty tickets where needed. Somerset County Council Traffic Dept. has advised us that no clearway exemption passes will be issued this year. I will again speak to residents of Bread Street regarding parking and possible alternative solutions. *Philip Appleton*, Village Liaison Manager

Refuse collection – if your bins are not collected by 4.00 pm on the Wednesday collection day then please 'phone Mendip or use their online form to report it. Mendip need to see a pattern of non-collection and this will only present itself if they can map a number of complaints. There are areas of the village where this happens, albeit infrequently, so please take the time to report it if your bins are not emptied.

Neighbourhood plan - Mendip has reviewed our first draft and is reasonably happy with it although changes have to be made and more evidence collected to support the objectives. The draft objectives will be put on the website and we are asking a professional organisation to carry out a housing needs survey in the village; this will probably happen in June or July.

Flood wardens – we will soon have warden volunteers who will alert the authorities and provide support to the emergency services if future flooding occurs. More information in due course.
