

WHO ARE WE?

So the clocks have changed and summer is now well behind us, the shops are encouraging us to look forward to December (which I am resisting although some of the baubles in the garden centre do look rather lovely....). Before we turn our thoughts in that direction we have November, a month to look back and to remember our past. We have a chance to remember people we have loved who have died, by lighting a candle at the All Souls Service on 1st November in Croscombe. The following week we remember those who served and died in wars, as we mark Remembrance Day. Both are occasions when the Church can provide the time and space to remember those close to us and those who have sacrificed their lives for freedom. Further details of these services are in this magazine.

We have a certain fascination with our past. One of the popular shows on television is 'Who do you think you are?' when well-known personalities research their family trees to find out where they have come from. Many of them find they are products of their past as well as their present, but I was wondering - do we actually ever ask the question 'who are we'? Maybe occasionally it is good for us to remember who we are, not just where we come from, not just what roles we fulfil, but who we actually are.

It is so easy going through life meeting other people's expectations and fulfilling the roles they need us to, but God wants us to have 'life in all its fullness', and that means allowing ourselves to be the person he has created us to be. Sometimes we also have to lay down some of our roles as children go off to university or ill health prevents us from doing what we used to do. But God wants us to know it is us he loves, not our roles - remember the words of Psalm 139 'For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.' God made us and he loves us; we were not just made to do but we were made to be. So this November why not spend some time 'being', getting back into contact with yourself and seeing yourself through God's eyes.

In **Croscombe** there will be an Act of Remembrance in the Parish Church, starting at 10.55am, and followed by a Remembrance Service and re-dedication of the refurbished bells by the Bishop of Taunton.

At **North Wootton** there will be a Family Service appropriate for Remembrance Sunday but prepared and led with the thought that there may well be people of all ages at the service. This will begin with a short Act of Remembrance.

At **Dinder** there will be a service of Holy Communion for Remembrance Sunday at 6.30pm.

Everyone is welcome at any of these services in the parish churches.

The Parish Council will then be able to monitor the crimes and pursue persistent crimes with the police.

Refurbishment of Worthy and Winding Lake Rooms - update

Together Pilton Village Trust and PWMC Ltd have been exploring plans for refurbishing our village building and plans for Worthy room have been carefully assessed. The conclusion reached is that significant refurbishment is not sensible at the present time due to cost and competing priorities. However we all recognise we need to 'do something, to improve the rooms for everyone. Therefore together we have decided to redecorate both Worthy and Winding Lake rooms and to seek funding to help with costs. We also want to take-forward developments and improvements identified in last year's village survey. These incur costs and money is tight. (e.g. It costs £30-40k annually just to keep the building open, and we keep a financial reserve to cover unexpected building-related costs). Most income comes from bar sales. We are doing what we can to increase this but we need to find additional income sources. Fund raising will be part of that - building on donations from the Spanish Evening, the Table-Top sale (organised by John Howe and Adele Robertson respectively) and the Tithe Barn Halloween party. We are at an early stage. If you have ideas to raise some funds for developments/improvements please contact us. Thanks.

Come and enjoy what's on offer, be part of the community, meet the regulars and help keep the facility alive and successful - even if the beer can't be free!
